The Worshipful Company of Goldsmiths, one of the City's Great Twelve, is fifth in precedence of all livery companies. It gained its Royal Charter in 1327.

It has been responsible down the centuries for the City of London's production and trade in gold, silver and platinum goods, with primary responsibility for hallmarking these. Even today the Assay Office is based here. Every year, the Trial of the Pyx - a very technical exercise - tests the quality of the nation's latest coinage. Hence, the Goldsmiths' Company is still very much attached to its original trade.

Goldsmiths' Hall, an imposing neo-Classical building by Philip Hardwick and completed in 1835, dominates Foster Lane. It is the third of the Company's halls on this site having survived a very near miss during the Blitz.

Our tour will be conducted by the Company's Librarian, lasting about an hour.
