The Ironmongers' Company

The earliest records suggest that the Ironmongers, then known as Ferroners, were an effective body in 1300, when they took action against the smiths of the Wealds of Kent and Sussex over the quality of iron supplied for the wheels of carts in the City of London.

The Company is tenth in order of precedence and is, therefore, one of the Great Twelve Livery Companies. It has about two hundred and eighty freemen. One hundred and thirty of them are liverymen, of whom thirty eight are on the Court, and the rest are freemen.
